**Informational Filing - Effective Date of Certain Resource
Sufficiency Evaluation Enhancements Tariff Amendment
Revisions**

Dear Secretary Bose:

On March 11, 2022, the California Independent System Operator Corporation (CAISO) proposed a tariff amendment to implement resource sufficiency evaluation (RSE) enhancements prior to summer 2022 that improve performance and address several concerns expressed by stakeholders (March 11 Filing). By order issued May 27, 2022, the Commission accepted these tariff amendments and directed the CAISO to submit a filing to inform the Commission of the actual effective date within five (5) business days of implementation of the tariff changes.¹

The CAISO was able to implement most of the tariff changes on June 1, 2022, but there is one element that will not be implemented until a later date.² Therefore the CAISO submitted a compliance filing on June 7, 2022 in this proceeding to remove the tariff changes that were not implemented on June 1, 2022. This informational filing is being submitted to notify the Commission of the

actual effective date of June 1, 2022 for the tariff changes that are included in that June 7, 2022 compliance filing, all of which have been accepted by the Commission in this docket. The CAISO will file a second informational filing when the balance of the tariff changes are implemented, which is tentatively expected to occur on June 15, 2022.³

The CAISO has served copies of this filing on all the parties to the service list for this proceeding. In addition, the CAISO is posting this filing on the CAISO website.

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³ The March 11 Filing proposed a number of redlined tariff changes within the same tariff record (version 19), which is for CAISO tariff section 29.34. All tariff changes proposed in the March 11 Filing took effect on June 1, 2022, except for new section 29.34(l)(2)(A)(iv). Therefore, the new section 29.34(l)(2)(A)(iv) in those redlines needed to be removed from the tariff record that took effect June 1, 2022. Also, the three cross-references to the new section, which were contained within the same tariff record in section 29.34(l)(2)(A), section 29.34(m)(1)(A), and section 29.34(m)(1)(B), needed to be removed from the tariff record for consistency. To reflect these changes, the CAISO filed a new tariff record (version 20) using TOFC 80 on June 7, 2022, with a fixed effective date of June 1, 2022. The CAISO submits this informational filing to confirm that effective date pursuant to the directive in the May 27 Order to notify the Commission, in a filing under TOFC 150, of the actual effective date of the tariff revisions within five business days of their implementation. After new section 29.34(l)(2)(A)(iv) is implemented, the CAISO will submit a second informational filing using TOFC 150, which will specify the actual effective date for the new tariff section 29.34(l)(2)(A)(iv) and the three cross-references to the new section described above, within five business days of that actual effective date (version 19).
